TOC: Test of Choice, state test on entry form. Freestyle entrants must also submit copy of 60%+ in highest test of level, or higher. Classes 273 & 274 exempt from 60% qualifying ride documentation.

NDPC: National Dressage Pony Cup High Score Ribbon; Classes 281, 381 count for NDPC high score, see www.NDPC.org for details. ALL PONY MEASURING must register in advance. Email the Secretary at least 1 week in advance if you have a pony you need to measure. A fee of up to \$50 vet charge may be applicable.

AQHA APPROVED: Heads up Quarter Horses!! Scores of 60% + can earn AQHA points for your horse at this show. To be eligible, horse and rider must meet all AQHA and USDF www.USDF.org membership requirements and the horse must be AQHA registered, have current AQHA papers, and have an AQHA Lifetime Dressage Competition License (nomination form available at: http://www.aqha.com/forms/pdf/AQHA_Dressage_Nomination.pdf).

LEVELS: USDF Intro - FEI Grand Prix & Para all current editions, 20 x 60 m rings. Para may request 20 x 40 m ring.

SCHOLARSHIPS: A ***Sporting Services Junior Dressage Scholarship*** is available for riders 21 and under, apply by August 15, see show website, click on Scholarships.

A ***Sporting Services Adult Amateur Scholarship*** is available for amateur riders over 21.

AWARDS:

- Trophy and ribbons through fifth in all classes.
- **USDF / Dover AA Medal** – Class 223, See USDF.org for details.
- **PRO-AM Teams** ~ Sign up for Saturday's Team Competition! **Purse: \$100 prize money plus 2/3 of tracking fees & prizes** awarded to winning team. One pro (or "open" rider) and 2-3 JR/YR or AA will comprise a team. Top 4 scores will be averaged to determine winner. Register in show office by 9 am Saturday with \$20 per team tracking fee. (*Intro, Material, DSE, MFS, Rider Test & Young Horse scores exempt.*)

Level Challenges: *Must show in designated class each day (two classes) to be eligible. Horse/rider pair not to have competed at a higher level at a USEF/USDF recognized show prior to this competition.*

Prize money & special ribbons. Prize money will be 1/3 of all entry fees plus \$100 added. 1-2 eligible – 1 payout (50%), 3-5 eligible – 2 payouts (60%, 40%), 6-7 eligible – 3 payouts (47%, 33%, 20%), 8-9 eligible, - 4 payouts (40%, 30%, 20%, 10%), 10 or more eligible – 5 payouts (32%, 25%, 20%, 13%, 10%).



ELIGIBILITY:

JR/YR - Open to Juniors and Young Riders only; any rider is eligible until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21. Only riders ages 14-18 may ride FEI JR Tests. Only riders age 16-21 may ride FEI YR Tests. Only riders ages 12-16 may ride FEI Pony Tests.

AA - Open to Adult Amateurs only; riders must compete as adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22. Must hold current USEF Amateur card.

PE - Riders must have a current USEF Dispensation Certificate which indicates their classification status to be eligible. **All tests in Standard arena unless requested in advance.**

CBLM - Colonel Bengt Ljungquist Memorial Championship qualifying class for 2016. Riders must be members of a participating group member organization at the time of the show to be eligible.

USDF Q - Qualifying class for 2018 GAIG/USDF Regional Dressage Championships. Declare qualifying ride on entry form. Class fee plus additional \$15 fee must be paid prior to start of the class.

OPPORTUNITY CLASSES - No USEF/USDF memberships or Horse ID required for Opportunity classes if entered ONLY in Intro and/or Opportunity classes. Horses entered only in Opportunity classes are exempt from the \$16 USEF fee. However, horses entered in these classes are still subject to and must comply with all D&M rules and are subject to drug testing at the competition.

STABLING:

Permanent stalls with door or screen in center aisle barns. All stalls at least 10 x 10. 2 bags of initial bedding is included in stall fee. No bags are included in Tack Stall fee. Extra bedding should be ordered in advance (\$8). **Please order your extra bedding with entry.** There will be a ***very limited quantity*** of extra bedding available at the show and it will be \$10 per bag.

Pinehurst Harness Track is located on N.C. 5 in Pinehurst, N.C. *From North:* US 1 South, exit at Morganton Road in Southern Pines, turn west (right) toward Pinehurst. Follow Morganton to end, turn South (left) on NC 5. Harness Track entrance is first left. *From the West,* take US 220 (I 73/74 corridor) to NC 211 east towards Pinehurst. Turn right at NC 5, Harness Track is 1.7 miles on left. Watch 35 mph speed limit here, Pinehurst police are vigilant! *From South:* US 1 to Aberdeen, turn left (West) on NC 5 to Harness Track, entrance approx. 6 miles on right, just beyond stoplight at Monticello Rd.

ARENAS: Four 20 X 60 competition arenas on all-weather sand / clay footing. Warm up is clay/sand area plus acres of irrigated, aerated turf with natural sand base. Three time USDF Region 1 Footing of the Year award winner.

HOSPITALITY: Welcome wine and cheese Friday evening. Competitor's Party Saturday evening. Complimentary coffee and donuts each morning. OTHER:

- Entries accepted on a first come basis by postmark/datestamp.
- Entries must be **received** by the closing date. **Waive signature on mailed entries.**
- Management reserves the right to combine or divide classes, add or substitute judges, or make changes as required by circumstances.
- All pets must be leashed at all times.
- Lungeing in designated areas only.
- Pony measuring to be done by appointment. **Email secretary at least one week in advance.** A Vet fee will be required, payable directly to vet.

ENTRY DOCUMENTATION REQUIREMENTS:

- Current USEF membership (or non-member fees) for Rider, Owner and Trainer, Coach
- Trainer is 'Any adult, or adults who has the responsibility for the care, training, custody or performance of a horse.'
- Coach is 'any adult or adults who receives remuneration for having or sharing the responsibility for instructing, teaching, schooling, or advising a rider in equestrian skills.'
- Current USDF membership (or non-member fees, number) for Rider and Owner. **Rider's USDF membership may be either Participating or Group, Owner's USDF membership may be Participating, Group or Business; if Rider/Owner's USDF # is a non-member ID #, the USDF non-member fee must be paid.**
- Horses must have either a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration or USDF Horse Identification Number unless competing ONLY in exempt classes.
- Failure to provide proof of USEF and/or USDF membership will result in competitor being charged Show Pass or non-member fees.
- Current (1 Yr) negative coggins.
- For Adult Amateur classes/status - USEF membership card must declare Amateur.
- Juniors and Young Riders must include birthdate.
- Freestyle entries - copy of a 60% + at the highest test of the MFS level or higher (exempt: FEI Jr /Yr/ Pony and Para).

FOR GAIG / USDF QUALIFYING CLASSES ALSO INCLUDE:

- Check "Qualifying" and add \$15 per Qualifying class.
- Copies of USEF and USDF Horse Registrations (**not HID #s**).
- Rider must have current Participating USDF membership; Owner must have current Participating or Business USDF membership.
- Rider and Owner must have current USEF membership.

ALL ENTRIES must have **THREE (3) signatures** - Rider, Owner and Trainer. If **Coach** is listed, must also have **Coach signature**.

Legal Guardian must sign for riders under 18 yrs. Trainer blank must be signed by person over 18 who assumes responsibility for horse. (Parents who sign as trainer are exempt from membership requirements). See www.usdf.org and www.usef.org and/or USEF Rule Book for further details on entry requirements.

ON-LINE ENTRIES:

Visit www.HORSESHOWOFFICE.com or link from www.SportingServices.net to enter on-line and pay via PayPal/major credit card with no extra fees.

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR218) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

HEADGEAR: From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Unless jackets are waived, while in the competition ring, exhibitors wearing protective headgear must wear a short, dark jacket, dark tailcoat (only permitted for tests above Fourth Level), or Armed Services or police uniform (if eligible), dark hatcovers (where applicable) and must otherwise conform to DR120 (see GR801).

All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final. Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise. The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges. Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees. Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation.

In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste. No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform. It is the tradition of the show that riders be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and the horses properly presented. Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitable presented to appear before an audience

Federation Entry Agreement

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of March Magic Dressage (Competition). I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4
